



## *What is Rocky Mountain Rett Association?*

Rocky Mountain Rett Association (RMRA) is dedicated to improving the quality of life for girls and their families impacted by Rett Syndrome (RTT). We achieve this by providing supportive services and resources to girls and their families, engaging in advocacy, education and awareness efforts, and raising funds to support the search for a cure and improved treatment options.

## *What is Rett Syndrome?*

Rett Syndrome (RTT) is a debilitating neurological disorder diagnosed almost exclusively in females and is thought to affect 1 in 10,000 females. RTT is a regressive disease, robbing children who have developed normally until 6-18 months of speech and motor skills. RTT leaves its victims profoundly disabled and completely dependent on others for every basic need.

## *What are RMRA's Needs for 2017-2018?*

RMRA raises \$50,000 a year to fund the Rett Clinic at Children's Hospital Colorado. Annually, the Clinic sees 60 girls, new and follow-up patients. Currently, the Rett Clinic is held every two months with a capacity for 6 new patients and 5 follow up patients per session, which is well below families' needs for access to service. Given that the Rett Clinic Medical Director at Children's Hospital has recommended seeing RTT patients at least once every two-years, an important goal for us is to increase our financial capacity to afford additional clinics to help us address the gap in the need for clinic services. The wait list for follow up patients is 12 girls, which due to the Clinic schedule equals a year behind schedule. **RMRA Goal: To raise an additional \$25,000 to cover the cost of a half-day Clinic that will allow providers to see 30 more follow up patients per year.**

## *What does your donation provide?*

RMRA's fundraising efforts benefit the Rett Clinic at the Children's Hospital. Founded in 2011, the Rett Clinic at Children's Hospital of Colorado has been designated as a Center of Excellence by Rettsyndrome.org and the International Foundation of CDKL5. The Clinic is a very unique setting where patients have the opportunity to be seen by up to 15 Rett doctors and therapists in one convenient location.
